About: A new pavilion for outdoor events and venues.


Phase 1 – 747 Exhibit

This phase consisted of the 747 exhibit with elevator tower and wing walk. It was completed shortly before I arrived at Stevens & Wilkinson.


Phase 2 – Pavilion

The second phase of the exhibit is the new pavilion located between the two planes. This is the project in which I was heavily involved in from beginning to end.








Left – Phase I 747 Exhibit Below – Phase II Pavilion




Pavilion is a simple sheltered platform /stage with restroom bar at the back to service the pavilion as well as the existing 747 exhibit.







About: A mixed-use apartment building on the beltline with shops and gathering/co-working spaces on the ground levels.



Here are a select few personal favorite photographs that tell a unique story of how I see the world.


















Other Work

While these works may be rudimentary in nature, I believe them to be pertinent to where my interests lie and what I am seeking to pursue in my career as a designer and future architect.


Included with these academic highlights are a few personal woodworking pieces that also help to tell the story of the underlying thoughts and ideas behind the things that I create.


Light House Project


About: This project is located at an abandoned lighthouse at Tybee Island. The proposed project is a restoration of the lighthouse with a living space for a lighthouse keeper.

The concept seeks to capture the panoramic views of the surrounding landscape and ocean while keeping the lighthouse at the center of the plan.










Activity Center





Furniture Design


About: The design of this chair was inspired by Reitveld's zig-zag chair and the intent was to create a critique about what a chair is and how it works. The seat is cantilevered creating what appears to be an impossibility and thus raises the question in people's mind of exactly what is possible.


The chair is constructed entirely of birch ply-wood and wood glue without the use of any type of metal fasteners.

Components are fastened together using wooden pegs as pictured in the seat bracket detail on the right.





The Third Space (Thesis Project)


About: Architecture is composed of three spaces; the here, the there and the inbetween, which I am referring to as the third space, a place of transition.


